Aquanauts Scuba Dive Center is back in full operation

Grenada, September 22.2004: Recovering steadily from Hurricane Ivan, the Aquanauts Grenada SCUBA dive shop at their True Blue Bay Resort location **is fully operational as of September 22.2004.** Electricity was restored to the location two weeks after the storm, two of the modern dive boats survived and they are currently taking reservations for dive trips.

"We have surveyed most of the reefs and wrecks over the last two days" said Peter Seupel, managing director of Aquanauts Grenada, "and find them in excellent conditions".

"Becoming fully operational as of September 22. has put us ahead of schedule in reopening. Our first large dive groups will be coming to Grenada in the end of October", said Gerlinde Seupel, director of marketing.

Although the dive shop at the True Blue Bay Resort location experienced no structural damage, the dock and water damage it sustained has been repaired. All reservations that were made directly with Aquanauts will have their booking transferred to the True Blue Bay Resort. Clients who made reservation via a tour operator or travel agent should contact them to have their holiday reconfirmed or rebooked.
